Our name comes from the Greek word for star, and at Astria, patients are the stars that guide us. Their stories inspire us, their successes energize us, and their challenges give us purpose.




STAR-0215

We are working to reduce the treatment burden for people living with HAE. We understand that current options for preventative therapies require frequent administration, and we believe that we can do better with STAR-0215. Our goal is to provide an effective preventative therapy, dosed once every 3 months or longer, to decrease the burden of disease and the burden of treatment for people with HAE.

We expect to file an Investigational New Drug application for STAR-0215 in mid-2022, and plan to initiate a Phase 1 clinical trial with initial results anticipated by year end 2022.

Our lead program, STAR-0215, is a monoclonal antibody inhibitor of plasma kallikrein in preclinical development with the goal of providing long-acting, effective attack prevention for HAE.



Meet Jasmine

We were thrilled to have the opportunity to meet Jasmine, a 21-year-old college student living with Type 1 HAE. Jasmine is a horseback rider, aspiring veterinarian, and HAE advocate.

"I noticed my health starting to change around my freshman year of high school. I was starting to experience certain swellings that I can now link with HAE...I was missing out constantly on school events, classes, tests, hanging out with friends and getting that time with them...it was definitely holding me back from being myself." — Jasmine



Jasmine is a college senior who is pursuing a career working with animals. Her journey to diagnosis with HAE was a rollercoaster for herself and her family. The diagnosis came when she was 17 years old, just a few months before she was supposed to leave for college. Despite hesitations about being a few hours away from home after this life-altering news, Jasmine decided to pursue her dreams at school. *"I was scared about the move, but I honestly thought of it as my future on the line,"* she says. *"This was one of the best schools and it had one of the best programs for what I wanted to study. I wasn't about to let my moment pass me by."*
